This course will give you a systematic understanding of public health resilience and response strategies. You will examine the role of public health resilience during disasters or crisis and consider key impacts upon the national,

regional and local healthcare framework. Systems will be considered for early warning and communication, alongside the development of strategies for mass casualty and mass fatalities Management.

- Role of health in crisis management.
- Strategic objectives in managing public health during a disaster or crises.
- Development of resilient healthcare systems.
- National, community and hospital based resilience.
- Issues of International assistance to public health.
- Communicating public information before, during and after health crises.
- Managing mass casualty incidents.
- Managing emerging infectious diseases.
- Engaging with wider healthcare providers during a crisis.
- A public health resilience and response simulation exercise.
